HELPFUL INFORMATION AND FRENCH MAJOR/MINOR REQUIREMENTS AND STUDY ABROAD

Were you aware that French 115 and 116 meet General Education requirements (MC-QR and MC-LH) and 115 meets your Bachelor of Arts language requirement? Once you've completed 115 and 116, you would only have 3 more French classes to complete a minor! You could even finish these 3 classes in one semester or one year. Some students choose to take 213.12 at ISU and then complete the final 2 course requirements during a summer study abroad to Grenoble, France or Quebec, Canada.
