I LOVE FRENCH--WHAT CAN IT DO FOR MY STUDIES AND MY CAREER?

CAP CREDIT

Credit for Acquired Proficiency (CAP) is obtained through earning a C or better in your *first* ISU foreign language course at the 112 level or higher. You can earn *up to* 8 hours of credit *for free* upon completion of both the class and CAP request form in STV 114.

GENERAL EDUCATION CREDIT

French 115 meets MC-QR and French 116 meets MC-LH.

STUDY IN QUEBEC OR GRENOBLE TO COMPLETE YOUR FRENCH MINOR!

Once you've completed

115 and 116 and earned CAP credit, you would only have 3 more French classes to complete a minor! You could even finish these 3 classes in one semester or one year. Some students choose to take 213.12 at ISU and then complete the final 2 course requirements during a summer study abroad in Grenoble, France or Quebec, Canada.
