- Levels are determined by a Spanish proficiency test once students arrive in Granada. After completing the Intensive Language Course, students are moved up one level from their initial level. If students want to estimate their level, they can look at sample DELE (a standardized Spanish language test) by going to this website: <https://exámenes.cervantes.es/es/dele/preparar-prueba>. In order to take electives in Spanish, students need to score at the Granada level 5, which is equivalent to the B1.2 proficiency level in the European system and on the DELE. A minimum of B2.2 proficiency is needed to achieve Granada level 7.
- The University of Granada workshops are not for credit, but they are an excellent way to meet local students and practice Spanish while enjoying an extracurricular activity.
