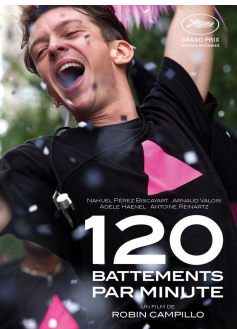
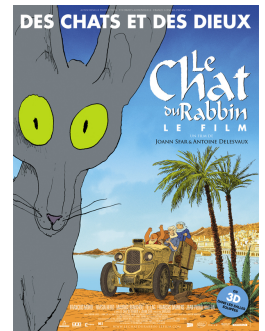


SEPTEMBER 13: *Le fabuleux destin d'Amélie Poulain (Amélie, 2001)*
