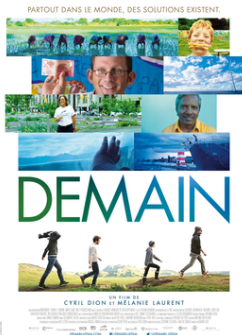

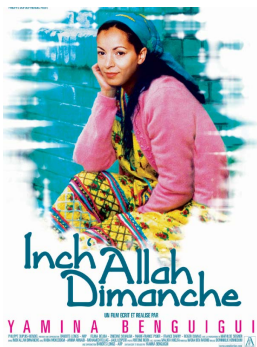
**MARCH 22: *Couleur de peau : miel* (Approved for Adoption, 2012)**

“This remarkable animated documentary traces the unconventional upbringing of the filmmaker Jung Henin, one of thousands of Korean children adopted by Western families after the end of the Korean War. **APRIL 19: *Inch’Allah dimanche* (Sunday, God Willing) (2001)**

“An Algerian wife joins her laborer husband in France during the ’70s, but finds both him and the country to be strangers. [...] This largely autobiographical [tale] communicates [...] the clash of customs and traditions between two very different cultures at a time of nascent feminism.” (*Variety*)
